Since our last report, Jamaica YES has been engaged in several important and rewarding activities as we continue our mission to help meet the essential needs of poor Jamaican school children. We have expanded our breakfast program, paid tuition for seven students and funded repairs to a school building.

We continue to seek out schools lacking the basic requirements for learning – well-nourished children, books, adequate shelter etc. We rely on word of mouth and recommendations from Food for the Poor to find and make contact with such schools in Jamaica.

Because of your support, children sit in a classroom with a full stomach, are protected from the elements, and are taught by a teacher who was given her entire salary that week because the children's school fees were paid. For your support, we, and the students that benefit from it, remain forever grateful.
